**Block Watch Checklist**

1. Contact the THA Neighborhood Watch Committee (email at [thablockwatch@gmail.com](mailto:thablockwatch@gmail.com)) and let them know you would like to be a Block Watch captain.
2. Talk to your neighbors about organizing a Block Watch. Feel free to organize a neighborhood gathering to give everyone a chance to get to know each other!
3. Obtain signatures on the Block Watch Petition from at least fifty-one percent of the households on your block.
4. Once your Block Watch petition is complete, contact the Neighborhood Watch Committee for help setting up a meeting between your Block Watch and a Community Interaction Officer from the KCPD. This officer will help your Block Watch learn to identify and report suspicious activities and help you discover other ways you can work together to keep your block safe
5. Once you have met with the Community Interaction Officer, your Block Watch is official! The Neighborhood Watch Committee will work with your block to obtain Neighborhood Watch signs and will be in contact with you periodically to communicate important crime-related news affecting your block.
